Kabardino-Balkarian State University (Russian Federation), University of Fribourg (Switzerland), GeoWel Research (Georgia) and the Russian State University for the Humanities (Russian Federation).

The North Caucasian Graduate School of Conflict Studies at the Kabardino-Balkarian State University is a leading research work package "Political Regimes: Communal Governance focused" on an analysis of processes related to governance, culture and economy of local communities in the North Caucasus. The panel will outline the main interim results and their possible applications in regional policies.
